Healthy Summer Travel

Whatever your destination when traveling be **proactive**, **prepared** and **protected** when it comes to your health and the health of those traveling with you.

Be Proactive:

- * Learn about your destination.
- * Do you have special health needs to consider when making your travel plans?
- * Think about your health status. Are you healthy enough to travel?
- * When traveling by car, make sure you stop every hour for a stretch break. During long airplane trips keep your feet and legs moving at frequent intervals.

Be Prepared:

- * Pack smart and remember to include a picture I.D, your health insurance card and a list of your current medications (both prescription and over the counter).
- * Have a family member or friend as a contact and make sure you give them all of your trip information – where you will be and when, along with phone numbers for reaching you.
- * Plan ahead for illness or injury. Take along a first aid kit, an antihistamine and an antacid.
- * Make sure you have an adequate supply of any prescription medications you take.

Be Protected:

- * Wear your seatbelt and protective gear such as helmets and lifejackets when appropriate.
- * When vacationing in foreign countries, be careful about consuming food and water...this includes keeping your mouth shut when showering and using bottled water when brushing your teeth.
- * Remember good hand washing.
- * Use sunscreen with at least 15 SPF and insect repellent.
- * Limit alcohol consumption.

The U.S. Catholic Bishops, including our own Archbishop Schnurr have emphasized the Christian principles involved in this issue. Archbishop Schnurr's statement has been posted to our parish website.

U.S. Catholic Bishops' Five Principles to Guide Immigration Policy:

1. Persons have the right to find opportunities in their homeland.
2. Persons have the right to migrate to support themselves and their families.
3. Sovereign nations have a right to control their borders, but they also must promote the common good.
4. Refugees and asylum seekers should be afforded protection.
5. The human rights and the human dignity of undocumented migrants should be respected.
