Batteries

Beauty & Personal Care products - lipsticks, mascara tubes, eye shadow cases, soap and lotion dispensers, chapsticks, eyeliner cases, lip liners; deodorant tubes; hair gel tubes

Caps - bottles, jugs, jars

Cell phones and landline phones

Clothing, gently worn

Computers, computer related equipment

Corks

Crayons, leave wrappers on – in a bag

DVDs, CDs, Floppy disks, VHS Beta & Cassette tapes,

Egg cartons

Eye glasses - carefully wrapped

Gardening tools - wheel barrels, wagons, tomato cages, spades, hoes, etc.

Kitty litter buckets

Light bulbs & tubes - incandescent, florescent, halogen, neon, CFLs, spotlights – wrap well

Metals, ferrous & non-ferrous

Plastic containers - # 1 – 7 – clean

Plastic planting pots - clean

Prescription bottles, over-the-counter medication and vitamin bottles

Pull tabs

Shoes of all sorts

Textiles - worn out

Toothbrushes, toothpaste tubes & caps, floss containers

Writing instruments - old pens & caps, mechanical pencils, markers, highlighters

Plastic bags, dry-cleaning bags, plastic shrink wrap – Kroger; Staples; bags only at Target; Kohls; Meijers

With computers & electronics, be sure to look for locations that are either eSteward certified, or meets the requirements of the Basel Convention.
